MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Election 1988 is just about here! An office of particular concern to genealogists doing research in Calhoun County is that of Clerk-ReGister. The person who holds this office for the next four years will directly affect the research you do in Calhoun County. This year, incumbent Marcus Gray faces a strong challenge from County Commissioner Ann Norlander. I talked with both candidates recently about the concerns of genealogists and the role we can play as volunteers in the Clerk-Register's office.

MARCUS GRAY is very interested in having volunteers work in the office. One project suggested by a staff member is to proofread the birth index which they are now using. They have found that it contains many inaccuracies and are anxious to improve its usefulness. Marcus has extended the hours records are available to the public, and said that those hours could be further stretched for individuals if excessive demands were not placed on Do what you can to encourage his staff. Appointments, while desirable, are no longer required.

ANN NORLANDER has expressed great interest in making records accessible to the public. She plans to turn a currently vacant office into a research room where genealogists and the general public could have desk space for their work. She, too, would like to see a volunteer program and would set aside a desk for volunteer workers. Ann is extremely concerned that the public be treated in a courteous, friendly manner, and that staff be as helpful as possible.




