PRESERVE A NEWSPAPER

Did you ever want to preserve an edition or section of a newspaper? Here's how to do it. Dissolve a milk of magnesia tablet or one tablespoon of milk of magnesia emulsion in a quart of club soda, recap tightly and let stand in the refrigerator overnight. Pour into a pan large enough to accomodate the flattened newspaper. Soak newspaper one to two hours, remove and pat dry. The solution cannot be reused. Estimated life is 200 years. The list of descendants he gave me is notable both for its length and its detail.

Wish to correspond with descendents of William PEPPET. William and his wife Elizabeth (WEST) settled in Homer Mi. in 1863. He died in Homer on 28 May 1893. He was a carriage maker from 1863 to 1872 and a photographer from 1872 to 1893. His children were: Elizabeth b. 1841 m. BROMAN. Anna b. 1843 m. David KIRBY. GEORGE b. 1845 m. Sarah HENDERSON. William b. 1848. Mary Jane b. 1850 m. Edward WALDREN. and Alice b. 1852 m. WATERMAN. From second wife Josephine (DOOLITTLE). Mary (Mae) b. 1865 m. Gary Fisher. Children: Elizabeth. I am seeking information on the ancestry of Eli EDDY and his wife, Lydia LANE. Both were b. in NY, he c. 1803, she c. 1800. They had four children whose names are currently known to me. The eldest was (1) Timothy EDDY, b. c. 1825 in NY. (2) Betsey A. EDDY was b. c. 3 Dec., 1827 in NY. (3) Eliza Jane EDDY was b. c. 1833 in NY. (4) Mary E. EDDY was b. c. 1836 in NY.

All available evidence points to this Eddy family having arrived in Cass Co., MI from NY sometime between 1840 and 1850. Eli, Lydia, Timothy and Mary E. appear together on the 1850 Federal Census for Porter twp. of that county. As far as I can tell, Eli Eddy never again appears in a St. Joseph, Cass or VanBuren Co. Federal Census after 1850. It is possible that he d. between 1850 and 1860, almost certainly by 1870. Lydia was still living in 1870 and is listed as being a resident in Eliza's household.

There is a possibility that the Eli Eddy I want is the same one listed on page 179 of the 1840 Federal Census for the Town of Clarkson, Monroe Co., NY. Ages of the six family members listed above match perfectly, but there are two males age 10 and under 15 listed in the household in NY in 1840 that cannot be accounted for in MI in 1850. Is it also possible that the David Lane enumerated next on that same page of the 1840 census for the Town of Clarkson, Monroe Co., NY could have been a relative of Lydia Lane Eddy? Don't suggest the Eddy Family Association in Middleborough, MA., they have come up dry on this one. Please send any information to Linda H. Wilbur, P.O. Box 85, Albion, MI, 49224.

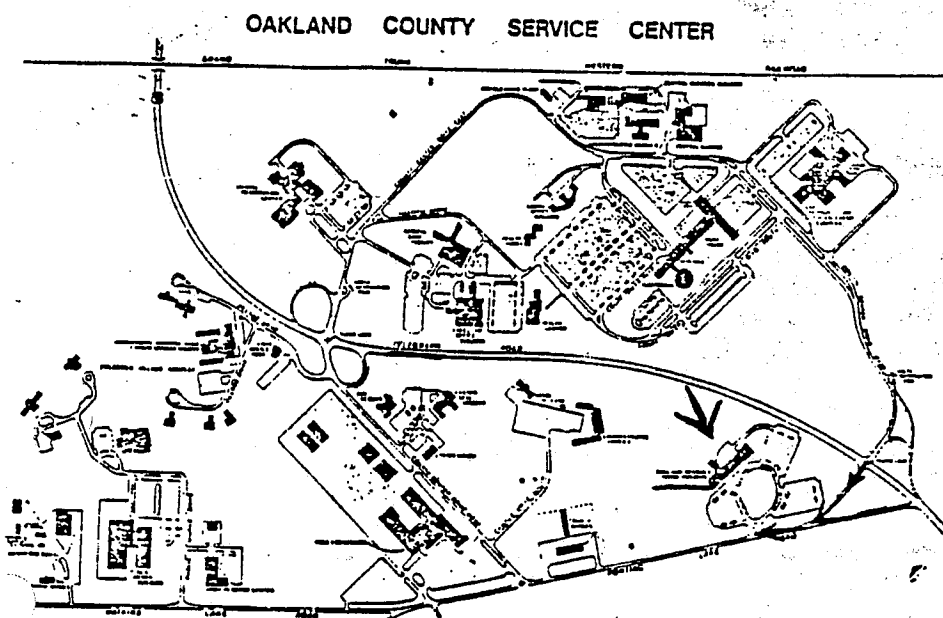
