### President's Message

I am a delegate and corresponding secretary for the Michigan Genealogical Council. One of the things I like about being a delegate is that I get to hear what is going on at the Library of Michigan and the Archives of Michigan. Then, I report that information to our society.

There are a lot of good things going on in the Michigan genealogical community. Some things are happening in the background and some are available for you to partake in. First, the 1941 Michigan death certificates are available for your use at Seeking Michigan.

Next, for users of the physical records at the Archives, new requisitions include records pertaining to Maine. As I mentioned at my presentation on New England Roots, Maine is a tough state to research. Hopefully, these new materials will help those with Maine ancestry. To see what is available, use the online Answer catalog at http://35.8.7.98/search~S37 Other news from the archives is about county histories. They are a great way to research the area where your ancestor lived. The Archives of Michigan has "The County Histories of the Old Northwest" (IN, IL, OH, WI, PA, and NY) series. This record group had never been individually catalogued. It is now, thanks to the Archives staff. It can be found in the Answer catalog of the Library and Archives of Michigan. There are over 1700 histories, with 750 counties new to the catalog.

The Archives of Michigan has some of Michigan's state Sanitarium records at the Archives. A death certificate of the person you are researching is required to access this collection housed at the Archives.

The digitization of the Michigan Naturalization records is complete. It was available for indexing through Family Search, but had to be pulled due to the complexity of the records. I

indexed a few of the records and one thing I can say is that no two records are alike. There wasn't a standardized form when the records were recorded. The staff at the Archives of Michigan is working with Family Search to solve the unique problems of indexing this group. Once these problems are solved, indexing will be available through Family Search. 100's of thousands of images are scanned and will need to be indexed. This is a huge project that will take a while to finish. The latest news on this project, as well as tutorial videos, can be found here: http:// seekingmichigan.org/naturalization As if the above isn't enough to keep you busy there is one event you will want to consider going to that is held every year: the Family History Seminar at the Lansing Family History Center, 431 E Saginaw Hwy, East Lansing, MI 48823. This seminar will be held Saturday, April 22, 2017 from 9:00 to 3:15. This FREE seminar is well attended with great speakers known throughout the genealogical community. Registration is required.
