

Albion District Library: Highlights of the Local History room include obituary database with over 52,000 obituaries; Riverside Cemetery Records; Veterans Project-tapes of veterans who lived in Albion, currently being transferred to DVD including WWII through Vietnam and a couple for Grenada and Persian Gulf Wars; Maps and Atlases for Albion, Calhoun County and Michigan; Sanborn insurance Maps; plat maps; city records; photograph collection and index; special collections; Albion Historical Society Archives; Albion, Marshall and Homer newspapers and more. Local history librarian, Jennifer Woods and her volunteers are waiting to help you.

Helen Warner Branch of Willard Library: In addition to the stacks at the branch library, Willard Library has a lot of digitized items on their website. Some you need a library card to access and some are open access to anyone. Digital and on-site information includes Newspapers 1846-Present; Yearbooks 1895-2005; City Directories 1890-2015; Probate Records Index and Records; Historical Maps 1884-1932; Tales of Battle Creek; Beyond these Gates (1844-1980's); Battle Creek Homes & Buildings, c. 1940; Photographs from Battle Creek's History; Stuart A. Lassen Historical Battle Creek Postcard Collection; Dorothy Martich Black History Photo Archive; Country Club Hills Association: circa 1923; Google Bookshelf, a compilation of books related to the history of the area, that are free and available at Google Books; city and county records; Plat books from 1858; Cemetery transcriptions; local biographies and more.

Marshall District Library: marriages (1836-1915) deaths(1867-1933); census; church records Zion Lutheran Church (1857-1942); Calhoun County atlases (1873 to 1916); yearbooks (1899-2016); Marshall cemetery Indexes; Marshall city records; Marshall and Homer Newspapers and more. Local history librarian, Chelsea Johnson, is available to answer your questions.
