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ALBION TOWNSHIP HISTORY

The following comes from the 1877 History of Calhoun County, published by L. H. Everts and Company. We plan to excerpt such highlights regarding the very early settlement of the townships in Calhoun County that are included in this History over the next several issues of <u>Generations</u>. Willard Public Library in Battle Creek holds a copy of this County History (plus an accompanying index) for readers wishing more details.

The south half of the northeast quarter of section 2, entered October 16, 1830, by Ephraim HARRISON, was the first land transaction in the township of Albion. In 1831, Darius PIERCE, of Washtenaw County, Michigan, entered the northwest quarter of the same section - the same being then known as the "Forks of the Kalamazoo" and now occupied by the main part of Albion village. The entry was obviously speculative, as there followed a sale to Tenney PEABODY, of New York, for a profit of a hundred dollars.

Intending settlement, PEABODY, having completed his preparations, set out in December from Kempville, New York, a place situated at the mouth of Eighteen-Mile Creek, and now known as Alcott. He was accompanied by his family, and conveying his household goods and other moveable property in two wagons drawn by three yoke of oxen, traversed Canada, stopping to bivouac wherever night overtook him; crossed the river at Youngstown, and stopped five miles east of Albion, with a settler named BLACKFIELD. A rest having been taken, Mr. Peabody, accompanied by his nephew, Charles BLANCHARD, and a young man named Clark DOWLING, pushed on and made camp on a spot about ten rods from the present site of the Presbyterian church. The men arrived on March 4, 1832, and the family followed in the course of a week. Asahel FINCH was the first to follow PEABODY, and next came Wareham WARNER. In 1833, Peter HOMES, accompanied by his sons Charles D. and Patterson P., entered land on section 14, built a log hut, and were joined by the rest of the family in October of the same year. Later, John FABRIQUE, Vine MARKHAM, Orson WEST, and Samuel W. DOUGLASS settled on the same line of travel. Incoming settlers, travelers and land speculators frequently desiring accommodations of food and lodging, DOUGLASS opened a tavern in his house, which stood on the farm now owned by John BENHAM, and upon the road then known as the "Washtenaw Trail," leading from Jackson to Three Rivers.

Initial settlement in the southwest part of the town was made by Cyrus ROBERTSON, John and James VANDERBURG, a Mr. GRIDLEY, and others not recalled. Dr. HENDERSON came in contemporary with these and located one mile east of the Washtenaw trail. Land was entered in the same neighborhood by James SHELDON, Henry LUCE and the HEWELLS, Hiram and Ashbell. The pioneers upon the Concord road were Marvin HANNAHS, James LAKE, and Charles HANCOCK. Those in the western part of the township were Alvin C. WALDO, E. M. ROGERS, and Perry VIETS. Different states, but on or near the same thermal lines, contributed to the early population of the peninsular State. From Massachusetts came Peter HOLMES, who arrived at his destination June 4, 1833.

Jesse CROWELL, in company with D. L. BACON and Issachar FROST, bought about three hundred acres of land from PEABODY, and upon this tract laid out a village plat, whose record bears date of June, 1836. This was the origin of what was known as the Albion company. Wareham WARNER laid out lots in section 3 adjoining the village. To these he gave the name "Warner's Addition," which now constitutes the western portion of the village. A good name was desired for the embryo village, and the proprietors, among others, suggested that of Peabodyville. There was a lack of euphony about this title which caused it to be discarded, and the problem was referred to Mrs. Peabody, who called it Albion, after the town from which Mr. CROWELL had come. Prior to this the locality was known among hunters and trappers, and recognized by others as the "Forks of the Kalamazoo."

Congratulations to CCGS member Elma Wisnieski Carpenter, who, in conjunction with Donna Harris Hellewell and Terilee Carpenter Jensen, recently completed a book on her husband's family history: Abner McNair Carpenter, First Child of Robert Carpenter and Phebe McNair. His Ancestors and Descendants. The book is done in the Modified Register Style, has an every-name index and contains a multitude of family pictures. The work is a perfect example of the benefits of genealogy information sharing, as many people contributed to the book.

Abner McNair CARPENTER was the oldest of thirteen children born to Robert and Phebe McNAIR CARPENTER. Abner was born in Ontario County, New York on 21 Dec 1799. In 1821/1822 he married Rebecca McNAIR, daughter of John McNAIR and Hannah ALLEN. Abner's younger brother, Calvin Loomis CARPENTER, was born in Yates County, NY in 1808 and in the 1850's moved first to Branch County, MI and then to Calhoun County where he purchased land and raised his family of 14 children.

Future plans call for publishing information on the rest of Robert and Phoebe McNAIR CARPENTER's children.



WE'VE GONE HIGH TECH!

Calhoun County genealogical information is no available on the INTERNET, as part of The USGenWeb project. Early in 1996, a group of Kentucky genealogists organized the Kentucky Comprehensive Genealogy Database Project. It's purpose was to provide a single entry point for all counties in Kentucky where collected databases would be stored. As it neared completion, it was decided to expand the project to include all states. Volunteers were found who were willing to coordinate the collection of county pages for each state page. These county-level Web pages have built-in "links" to higher level (state and national) USGenWeb pages.

CLARKE HISTORICAL LIBRARY

The Clarke Historical Library was founded in 1954 when Dr. Norman E. Clarke Sr. donated his extensive collection of books and manuscripts to his alma mater, Central Michigan College. Dr. Clarke, a cardiologist in the Detroit area, loved history and focused much of his collection on the history of the Great Lakes and the old Northwest Territory.

Besides serving as the archives of Central Michigan University, the Clarke Historical Library provides insight into pioneer and rural American life. First-hand accounts of life, industry and business in small towns in Michigan provide a glimpse into the past along with detailed visual records documenting the appearance and growth of towns and their inhabitants. Newspapers on microfilm document a century of development in Michigan in which pioneer communities developed, prospered and sometimes perished.

The library has one of the finest collections in the state by and about Native Americans. Native American writers such as Blackbird, Wright and Simon Pokagon preserve in writing the cultural traditions and character of the eighteenth and nineteenth century Native Americans.

The collection houses the 36 letters of Joseph Garneau, a World War I soldier from Cadillac, Michigan, which describe his experiences in Archangel, a port in northern Russia, with the 339th Infantry Regiment. Included are the early journals of Michigan's Protestant Episcopal diocese, the diaries of Abel and Hannah Bingham which document life in Michigan's upper peninsula in the 1800's and papers which detail the financial dealings of Amos Gould and his family who settled Owosso in 1843.

The library has extensive material on the Strangite Mormon colony on Beaver Island in Lake Michigan. James Jesse Strang, rejected by the Mormon Church as the successor to Joseph Smith, moved his followers to Beaver Island where he proclaimed himself king on 8 July 1850. A large number of diaries, letters and publications written by Strang and his followers represent the story of the Michigan Mormons.

Sanborn Fire Insurance maps for 111 Michigan communities from the years 1945-1992 are on microfilm. The library's holdings include 65,000 volumes, 2,500 manuscripts, 11,000 reels of microfilm (most of which are of Michigan newspapers), 16,000 visual images and 3,000 maps.

The Clarke Historical Library is located on the fourth floor of Park Library, CMU's main library building. The collection is open to everyone. Materials may not be borrowed or removed from the reading room. The library is not open every weekend. Because the library conforms to various university schedules including the academic year, call ahead to inquire about hours.
