William was a distant cousin (3,4,5th). There were many relatives in the Ionia, Belding area. I am her grandson and was named after her Vernon who was a state trooper. Another brother was named Gaylord. Many of her descendants are today living in NE Ohio. She had at least 7 children. All in Ohio. I remember seeing our Michigan relatives last in 1963 just before she died. I remember because I was in the Navy and while in Belding, the USS Thresher went down with all hands. This was near Easter in April that year. Would be interested in any material that may relate, or contact with anyone who would be acquainted with her and her mother's last years. Her mother's last name was Messer. She passed away around the same time. She was living in a nursing home south of Belding. William Hopkins outlived Eleanora and I have no knowledge of when he died. He was in his late 70's maybe early 80"s in 1963, a rather robust man. Used to be a lumberjack in UP in early part of the century."



Region, Menigan - Daniel Saxton is shown here with horse and buggy in front of Divine Hotel, formerly known as the Welch House. The hotel was bought by Monroe Divine in abt. 1900. He died in 1909 and it was operated by his son, Chester Divine, after that. The hotel was located on the corner of the Kent Street and Grand River Ave. It was torn down May 21, 1975. It has been replaced by a Keusch service station.



Daniel Sexton was born July 23, 1835 in Wethersfield, New York. He died March 10, 1891 in Portland, Michigan Daniel enlisted in Co. D Ninth Regiment of Michigan Infantry on September 10. 1861. He was discharged on December 23, 1863. He was 5 foot 5 inches tall with grey eyes and brown hair. He was a farmer.

His obitudity read: Daniel F. Saxton, for many years one of the most prominent residents of Danby Township, but of late residing in this village Portland, Michigan), died early Thursday morning, after an illness which began a year ago last November. For months he had been in a precarious condition and no hope had been entertained for his recovery.

Mr. Sextor was born in Wethersfield, N.Y., July 23,1835, and while still a resident of that state he married Miss Anna E. Pelton. In 1858 they located in Roxand Township and residing there until 1867, when they moved to Danby. Two children, Mrs. George Swiler of Forley, and Wellington Saxton, of Portland, survive from this union, their mother's death having occurred in February,

1885. In November, 1889, Mr. Saxton married Miss Jennie Nash, who survives him, as does their son, Ferris Saxton, who is

employed one of the government offices in Washington and who came to Portland to attend the funeral.

Mr. Sexton moved from the farm in Danby to the village of Portland in 1902. He was a veteran of the civil war, enlisting with the Ninth Mich. Infantry, and serving until honorably discharged on account of illness.


John Saxton, of Portland Township, is a brother and the only survivor of a family of 9 children.
