CHURCH), and Serepta (married to Peter SNEATHEN) all resided in Boston Twp. His other brother, Jarvis TRAIN, lived in Whiteside, IL. Another sister, Ruby (married to Simeon HUNT) lived in Lowell, Kent Co., as did his step-mother, Caroline (who was the mother of Silas TAWL) (married to Eldridge G. WILLIAMS, daughter Martha) and Delia A. & Phebe A. TAWEL. Delia A. I believe married John HATCH. Caroline was living in Virginess, Kent Co., in 1867. Information on what happened to any of these people would be appreciated. Ael's wife was Olivia (25 in 1860) and three children in 1860, Lula S., 7; Ellen L. 5; and Willard B. 1mo. Also, does anyone know where Peter D. SNEATHEN and his wife, Serepta died? Or what happened to any of the following children: Isabell or Allebell or Ollie Belle, born in 1855; Fred B (who married Lecelia Annes Boston 29 Sep 1879); Hattie Alice Serepta - born in 1860 married Freeman H. 

WE HAVE HAD A NUMBER OF VERY INTERESTING SPEAKERS THE PAST FEW MONTHS. John Waite gave us a very interesting talk on the original people of Odessa Township, the Indians. John used maps and aides to show us how many of our roads are based on Indian trails and where we can see some of the original trail yet today. This aspect is seldom looked at in depth and John has done much research on the history of the Indian in our early society. Thank you John, for a unique and interesting talk on Odessa Township.

Pat Bravender spoke to us on Boston Township. She told us how and why townships are laid out the way they are; how to figure out where a piece of land is situated if you know the description. Each township is 6 x 6 square miles. She also took us over the important roles that each of the township officers played in the settlement of our ancestors. Many of the older township records have been lost to fire, etc. as they were stored in homes in the earlier times. But those that have been preserved can give us much information. For instance, election records may give the date of naturalization. They used to issue burial transit permits; there are perpetual care contacts at cemeteries, which can give you other family names. Minutes of meetings can also be useful for finding ancestors, if they held office, etc. Thank you Pat, it was very informative.

Grayden Slowins is our authority on Sebewa Township. He has published a book on the Schnable clan, and is the publisher of the Sebewa Recollector, a newsletter of the Sebewa Historical Society. The membership in the Society is \$5.00 per year and entitles you to the newsletter which is published 6 times a year. This newsletter contains information about the early settlers of this township. Back issues are available as long as supplies last. A complete set is available for \$50.00. Thank you Grayden for an interesting presentation.



RESIDENCE OF JACOB WHORLEY, SEC. 10. EASTON TR, IONIA CO., MCIH.

Jacob Whorley

The enterprising German is to be found in Ionia County, as in other parts of the country, pushing his way ahead, "niformly industrious and eventually well-to-do. The subject of this sketch, a true son of the Fatherland, has cured a good farm on Section 10, Easton Township, where he carries on the work of farming and stock raising. The one hundred and twenty acres of land to which he holds the title has been brought to its present state of improvement by his own efforts and good management, as when he took possession but three acres had been cleared. Like most of the land in the county it was covered by a heavy growth of timber, and it required long and arduous labor to bring in under cultivation. Mr. Whorley also owns eighty acres of fine land in Sebewa Township. The deprivations which accompany life in a sparsely settled district were not borne by Mr. Whorley alone, but were shared by a wise and capable wife who in her own department of their affairs did as much as he to build up their fortunes and increase their comfort.

The kingdom of Wurtemburg, Germany, is the place of the nativity of Mr. Whorley, and his birth occurred January 28, 1831. His parents were Peter and Rebecca Whorley, the former of whom was a master weaver. In accordance with the custom of the country our subject was placed in school during his childhood and pursued his studies until he was fourteen years old, thus gaining a good knowledge of practical branches. Since he came to America he has acquired a sufficient knowledge of the English language to transact business affairs and enjoy the companionship of the English-speaking people about him. When he left school he began an apprenticeship with his father, and at the expiration of three years took up the work of a journeyman weaver, which he followed some two years. For the same length of time he was engaged in cotton spinning.

Having been led to believe that the broad lands of America and its free institutions made it desirable for residence, Mr. Whorley took passage at Havre, France, during the year 1852, and after thirty-nine days landed in New York City. He went to Monroe County, where he worked as a farm hand more than six years. For the first year's labor he received \$112 and board, and for the second and third \$144 and board. He then married,

d in lieu of his board had his wages raised to \$250 per year. His services were so highly valued that he was given some valuable farm privileges, including house rent. He and his wife were prudent and economical, and having determined it possible to secure a good home, they came to this State where land was cheaper than in the East, and where their little capital could be profitably expended. They bought the property which they now own, and by industry and perseverance increased its value year by year.

The lady who became the wife of Mr. Whorley in the Empire State, August 12, 1856, was Mrs. Anna (Lapp) Caswell. She was born in the providence of Ontario, Canada, October 22, 1828, and while living there was married to James Caswell, and they became the parents of three children, two of whom are living – Sarah Elizabeth and Oscar C. When in her twenty-seventh year Mrs. Caswell went to Monroe County, N.Y., and there was united in marriage with our subject. Her parents were Jeremiah and Sarah Lapp, the former of whom was born in England, and the latter in Canada but of English parentage. The mother died when the daughter was but eight years old, and the father January 7, 1863. Mr. & Mrs. Whorley had four sons, whose names are: George, Henry, Mathew and Willis.

The only office Mr. Whorley has held was that of Treasurer of his school district, but in that which goes to make up good citizenship he is not found wanting. Politically he is a Democrat, and is identified with the Patrons of Industry, as well as being interested in other movements that promise well for the neighborhood. He is a man of much intelligence, retains the enterprising spirit which has brought him worldly prosperity, and has a leading place among the German-American citizens of the county.

We invite the reader's attention to a view of the fine estate of Mr. Whorley which is present in connection with this biographical notice.

This is to inform you of the existence and purpose of the Blanding Genealogical Publications, Inc., a non-profit operating foundation hereafter referred to as BGP. This is a foundation formed for the purpose of collecting unpublished genealogies to put them on file for posterity and to publish and distribute them to genealogy libraries.

It has been recognized that in too many cases a family genealogy has been compiled and then lost after the demise of the compiler. To illustrate this point, please consider this scenario. An old man had his family history all worked out and in a big notebook. It was quite complete and accurate and his family was very proud of it. He died a couple of years ago and must have taken that book with him because it can not be found. It must have gone out with the trash of his estate. To avoid these losses this Foundation, the BGP has been formed and funded by an endowment. We enclose herewith an application form to be used by any genealogist in submitting a genealogy to the foundation. The form sets forth our criterion. Any genealogist may submit a returnable copy of a genealogy if it is within the criterion. The Foundation will microfilm it and make a conversion copy in 16 mm microfiche. A copy will be filed with Ryerson Library in Grand Rapids, Michigan. The BFP will make copies available to other libraries without charge. The original genealogy will be returned to the donor with a set of microfiche. The Microfilm master will be placed in permanent storage in the BGP archives. Unless otherwise specified, all copy requests will be given microfiche.

We want to do all we can to reduce these needless losses of unrecorded genealogies and solicit your help and suggestions in this effort. We recognise that we are undertaking a gargantuan effort and need all the help we can get. Contributions to our endowment funds are needed and will be gratefully appreciated.

We must repeat that this is a not-for-profit philanthropic activity serving the general good of genealogy. We are legally prohibited from making or distributing any profit.

The BGP will not do any clerical work of any kind. All will be microfilmed exactly as received.

Criterion & Application
for submitting a Genealogy to the BGP

Genealogies to be submitted to the BGP for publication must be in the following format and contain all of these data:

- ...They must be of a quality suitable for photo reproduction at 8.5 x 11.
- ...Half-tone and color photographs may not reproduce well and all copy will be black and white.
- ... Name and addresses of local libraries pertinent to the genealogy shall be provided when available.
- ...Genealogies submitted will be copies of 16mm microfilm and converted to microfiche and a copy will be returned to the donor with the original data.
- ...The microfilm original will be filed in permanent storage in the BGP archives. One copy in microfiche will be filed with the Ryerson Library in Grand Rapids, MI. Copies will be available to other libraries without charge.
- ...Only completed genealogies should be submitted. We recognize that the term complete cannot be applied to genealogies. If you feel sure that all available sources of data have been exhausted and see no reasonable expectation of new data being found, then you may consider your work to be complete and ready for publication. It is important that we avoid update resubmission's in a short period of time. This must be a judgment call and we can only rely on your judgment.

All five of the following sections of data should be included:

1. Introduction - A basic statement of the family original with pertinent notation. This should included the form of the genealogy. If some of both forms are used, this should be properly noted.

Ancestral - is from the present tracing ancestors

Descendant - is from the first known tracing descendant.

- 2. A Table of Contents
- 3. Text All pertinent genealogy data on the family shall be presented in an orderly format and should include reference to the sources of data.
- 4. A Synopsis of source and reference data.
- 5. An Index of all names in the genealogy. Other sections may be included if desired, but the index must be last.
