Gentlemen—Your Committee to whom was referred the matter of erecting a dam at the outlet of White Fish lake, in the Township of Pierson. pursuant to the provisions of Act No. 202 of the Public Acts of 1911 authorizing the Board of Supervisors in counties to determine the natural height and level of waters of inland navigable lakes and to erect and construct suitable dams of embankments to maintain the natural height and level of said lakes in order to improve navigation and promote the public health and welfare, beg leave to report That on or about the fifth day of

December last we inspected the proposed dam-site at the outlet of White Fish lake in the Township of Pierson and the surrounding territory, and interviewed the citizens relative to the proposed project and after a thorough investigation we beg leave to recommend:

That the County Surveyor be and hereby is instructed to make a survey relative to said project and determine the natural height and level of the waters of said lake, and by monuments and bench marks permanently establish and designate the same and file a report of his survey, and notes relating thereto with the Clerk of the Board and that on receiving such report the Board may take such action relative thereto as they may deem proper and necessary.
